Dear Parents and Carers,

As we near the end of another busy and exciting term, I wanted to take a moment to share some of the amazing things that have been happening at school lately. It's been such a joy to see our students getting involved in so many different activities, both inside and outside the classroom.

First off, a huge thank you to our wonderful PTA! They recently organized a fantastic disco event, and it was such a hit! A big thank you to all the volunteers who helped make this possible. Not only did the children have great fun, but events like these help bring our whole community together in such a special way.

We've also had some fantastic learning opportunities beyond the school grounds. Our Year 5s were lucky enough to attend a beautiful performance at the Opera House, watching Ballet D'Jerri. It was an amazing chance to experience the arts firsthand, and I'm sure it left them with memories they'll never forget. Their behaviour whilst watching this wonderful production was impeccable and a credit to the school – well done Year 5! Meanwhile, our Year 1s enjoyed a trip to the museum, diving into the world of historical toys. It was the perfect way to bring their classroom learning to life and see how people played in the past.

Another exciting highlight was our last Trinity Action Group (TAG) session of the term. These sessions give our students a voice and allow them to actively shape their school experience. We're so proud of how our children are taking the lead in making Trinity School even better.

In the KS1&2 assemblies this week, Mrs Sleath focussed on the 'sleep' aspect of the Decider Skill 'SELF'. The children discussed how many hours are advised to sleep for each age, the benefits of sleep and also the effects of blue light which can affect our quality of sleep. The KS2 children also talked about online safety around Artificial Intelligence (AI) and the sharing of information online.

My **Communication TAG** are working on something new: digital signage around the school. We put a lot of thought into this, and we can't wait to roll it out soon. It will help us keep everyone updated on important info in a more interactive and fun way. The children were delighted to make some big decisions with us!

Wellbeing TAG gave their opinions on the first My Happy Mind module and wrote a feedback form to be completed by all the classes. They also created a display for the sheltered area in the playground for the next module called 'Celebrate'. They also want to remind parents to sign up to the app – details were sent out recently about this.

In the **Eco TAG** meeting, they learned about the importance of bees in our ecosystem and how they help our planet. Bees are amazing little creatures that help to pollinate flowers, fruits and vegetables, which means they play a big role in helping plants grow and keeping nature balanced. To help to spread awareness, we used recycled materials to make junk model bees and created colourful painted collages to show our friends and families. We're proud of our work and hope that it helps others understand just how important bees are!

Opal Tag During our last TAG meeting we took a walk around the Nature Trail at the back of the Riley Field. We used the opportunity to think about how we could make more use of this area either during the school day or at lunchtimes. Next Monday we have our rearranged visit to Samares School. Four children from Y5 & Y6 will be visiting, along with Mrs Fillieul and Mr French to see an Opal Playground in action. We aim to gather lots of information and advice, so that we can start planning our next steps towards our own Trinity Opal Playground.
