In our online safety lessons, we have been learning about copyright and ownership. This means that when we create something, like a picture or a story, it belongs to us.

A design using a simple app (like Paint or a drawing app)

Talk Together

While working together, you could ask:

- How did you make your picture?
- How would you feel if someone took your work?
- What should people do before using someone else's work?



What to do together

1



Talk about it

Ask your child: "Who made this artwork?"
Help them say: **"I did! It belongs to me!"**

2



Create your artwork

Let your child take the lead.
Encourage them to choose colours, shapes and ideas.

3



Save the work

Show your child how to save their picture.
Explain: **"Saving keeps your work safe because it belongs to you."**

4



Share with school

Please upload your child's artwork to **Tapestry** so we can celebrate their wonderful work.



Key Message



If I make it, it belongs to me!

This helps us respect our own work and the work of others online.



Top tip for parents

Keep a copy of your child's artwork at home too – it shows them that their creations are valued and important.
