In Early Years, we have been learning about information and how we can share things online.

Children are learning that when we share something online, other people can see it.



What we are learning



To understand what information is



To know what online means



To understand that we can share information online



Home Learning Task

Let's Share a Photo!



Work together to take and share a safe photo.

1 Take a photo

Take a photo of something your child likes.



2 Talk about it

Ask your child:

What is in your photo?



Why did you choose it?



Explain:

"This is information you are sharing."



3 Talk about online

When we upload to Tapestry, other people (such as your teacher) can see it.



4 Choose safely

Help your child choose a safe photo to share. Avoid sharing personal details (e.g. home, address).



Talk Together

- What is information?
- What do you like sharing with others?
- Who can see things we put online?
- Who helps us share things safely?



Key Message

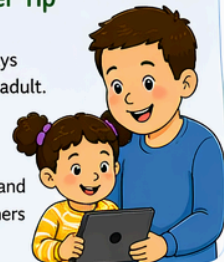


A grown-up helps me share safely online.



Parent/Carer Tip

- Children should always share online with an adult.
- Talk about what is being shared.
- Help children understand that online means others can see it.
