Build confidence

Reinforce:
“I know what to do if something doesn't feel right online.”



Talk Together

- What makes an online experience positive?
- What should you do if someone is unkind or makes you uncomfortable?
- How can you stay safe when talking to others?
- Why is it important to act quickly if something feels wrong?



Parent/Carer Tip

- ✓ Recognise signs of unsafe situations
- ✓ Use simple strategies (block, report, tell)
- ✓ Feel confident asking for help
