<b>English</b>	4 reading sessions each week. 4 spellings lessons per week (spelling rules and common exception words). Writing genres: Letters, biographies, narrative, poetry and cross curricular writing opportunities. Book studies: Cinnamon, Little People, Big Dreams (Amelia Earhart), The Present, The Night Box	
<b>Maths</b>	Initially we are working on bar charts and pictograms. Then we will move onto fractions, angles, shape and perimeter. We will also be revising our work on calculation and times tables.

#### Home Learning

Weekly homework will consist of:

- There may also be some small additional tasks at times when relevant.
