Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you, as always, for your continued support of Trinity School. I would also like to extend a particular thank you for your flexibility and understanding yesterday and this morning following the disruption caused by last night's storm. Your calm and supportive approach is very much appreciated and helps us ensure the children's safety and wellbeing remains our priority.

A warm welcome back to the Spring Term – it hardly seems possible how quickly the year is already flying by. It has been a pleasure to see how well all the children have settled back into their routines, with learning well under way across the school. There is a real sense of focus and purpose in classrooms, and it has been lovely to see pupils engaging so positively with their learning.

This term, our whole-school focus remains firmly on the curriculum. Our curriculum teams are working extremely hard to ensure that every subject is well sequenced, coherent and ambitious for all learners. Early looks at pupils' books already show the impact of this work, with clear progression and growing depth of understanding evident across subjects.

During the latter half of this term, I will be carrying out an internal review focused on inclusion in its widest sense. This will look closely at how we ensure that each and every child has access to the right curriculum and the right support to help them thrive. I will be looking for this in everyday classroom practice, ensuring that inclusion is lived and breathed in all that we do.

We also have some exciting learning opportunities coming up this term. Year 1 pupils will be taking part in Bikeability, helping them to develop confidence and safety skills on their bikes. In Year 5, pupils will enjoy an immersive French experience with Mrs Mann, with French being taught for an hour a day, three times a week. We are also already looking ahead to the Crabbe residential in March, which promises to be a fantastic and memorable experience for the children involved.
